President's Message



As you may recall, last month I mentioned that I was going to experiment with digital graphics as an art form. Since that memo, I have obtained and set up the graphics tablet, loaded the software, etc. Here's what I have learned.

The learning curve is essentially a line straight up. That's for both the software and hardware. Installation of the setup and getting everything to work took a long time. The hookup



between the computer and the tablet is complicated and can be done a variety of ways. The software came with a 900- page document that, fortunately, I was able to study before getting started. The tablet came with a little fold-out card with some icons on it that was supposed to show me how to hook it up. No help – it took me an hour to find the power-on switch.

You need a fire-breathing computer to make all this work. During last summer, my previous machine went toes-up, so I replaced it with a computer that had this digital art thing in mind. Still, you need to pay attention to the necessary features in advance.

My first impression is that the time it takes to do a digital picture is longer than it took to do the same thing using oils. The attention you pay to color and application is about the same between the media. The digital thing has the advantage of erasing an error by pushing a button, rather than waiting for the bad paint to set before repainting the mistake. The application of color to the piece seems to take a long time, partly because the "mixing" of digital paint takes some trial and error. But, I'm still on the learning curve.

In other items, by now you have received the announcements and information about our Spring Membership Show at the GEO. I encourage you all to put something together so that we have a good representation of the different kinds of work our members do. This is a judged show, so go for the gold.

Stay safe and keep painting, sewing, casting, throwing, chiseling, soldering and hammering.



MARCH PROGRAM ~ Stefanie Girard

Our March guest speaker will be Corinne Lightweaver.

Artist Corinne Lightweaver will present her extraordinary and deeply moving artwork about her experiences with breast cancer and mental illness. Her presentation will include the following topics: collage as autobiography, developing a personal mythology, working from what you know, the role of the unconscious, and the role of art making in healing. Her new art book, *The Psyche's Gifts: Art. Art Making, and the Journey from Mental Illness to Mental Wellness* includes 38 color plates and will be available on Bookshop and Amazon.



Corinne Lightweaver is an artist, writer, editor and author. Her artistic journey began in painting, with wildlife as her favorite subject, and also included forays into other media, like ceramics. Later, she began experimenting with collage

and assemblage techniques. In addition to creating artwork, she has curated several art and photography exhibits, written about the process of art making, and edited books and articles on the arts, artists, and art conservation.

After being diagnosed with breast cancer, Corinne began using discarded fabric scraps and objects, as well as new methods—cutting, pasting, and piecing—that comprised the best storytelling method for piecing a body and a life together again.

Lightweaver's art is featured in the book From the Canvas to the Couch: Art and Cancer. She is one of five Los Angeles artists in the book, who "demonstrate how visual art is a powerful tool to address and work through, in a most creative and imaginative way, the multiple losses brought about by cancer." Corinne has a strong body of work illustrating her lived experiences with obsessive-compulsive disorder, anxiety, and depression. While the work stands on its own, she also shares it in order to reduce stigma about mental illness and to provoke dialog between people with mental illness, their loved ones, and the general public. Part of this collection will be featured in the upcoming art book The Psyche's Gifts: Art, Art Making, and the Journey from Mental Illness to Mental Wellness.

Since 1996, Lightweaver's artwork has been exhibited throughout Southern California and other venues. Her artwork is held in private collections in New York, Chicago, Tucson, and multiple California locales. For more information about the artist and her work visit her

2021 BAA Annual Spring Members' Show

The Fall and Spring Shows are yearly events where we exhibit and are judged on our best work. This year the month of April will bring our annual judged Spring Show to the Geo Gallery. **Take-In is on Saturday, April 10, 9am-1pm**. The show will run through the end of June. You must be current with dues paid in full to enter the show. Half-year (Feb-Aug) renewal and new **membership dues must be paid by March 15**. No new memberships will be accepted at take-in. (See Membership article in this Newsletter for details.)

The GEO Gallery is located at 1545 Victory Blvd., Glendale (between Western and Sonoma). Masks will be required and social distancing should be maintained. Entrants will bring artwork to the back of the building, where you will check-in and pay the entry fee. **Entry fee is \$20.00** payable at take-in by cash or check.

Artwork: Please keep in mind the smaller size of the Geo Gallery and plan your work accordingly.

Only one piece per member is allowed and the maximum size for artwork is 36" high x 24" wide.

The Geo Gallery can only display wall art. If you have art that needs special consideration, we will do our best to accommodate, but this must be discussed with us ahead of take-in date. Entries must be original, new artwork that not been previously shown at a judged BAA show. Artwork must be properly framed and wired for hanging - no saw-tooth, nails or taped-on hangers, and with proper wire, no strings! Canvases must have neatly painted or finished edges with no staples showing. Watercolors, drawings and other easily damaged work should be covered with glass or plexiglass if larger than 18"x24." We will check artwork for proper framing and wiring. If not properly wired, we can fix or rewire your piece for a "fee" (a \$5.00 donation to the gallery fund). Otherwise, you'll have to bring it home, fix it and bring it back.

Open Division Categories include: Landscape, Seascape, Cityscape; Still Life/Floral; Life, Genre (People/Animals); Abstract/Contemporary; and Photography. Ribbon awards will be presented to First, Second and Third Place winners in each category, plus Honorable Mentions as determined by the Judge. Best of Show award will be presented from the overall show.

Online Catalog: We will produce a digital catalog of art in the exhibit to be posted on our website and social media pages, along with a video tour of the exhibit. To be featured in the catalog, you MUST submit a photo of your entry by March 20. (Artwork not pre-submitted may be accepted at take-in, but it will NOT be featured in the catalog.) Be sure you send us a good photo that is clear, straight and in focus. When taking a picture, try to avoid glare on canvas surface or take a photo before it is under glass. Photos must be 300 dpi to look really good. If you know how to do this, great! If not, send the best picture you can take – Ren will work his magic. If you need help getting a photo image, let us know and we will try to arrange something. I encourage all members entering the show to submit a photo to have your artwork in the catalog. (You can see the Fall Show catalog on our website to see how it will look.) Email your photo to me at: ellieoklein@gmail.com.

Along with the photo of your entry, you must include the following information:

- Name, e-mail address and phone contact
- Title of Artwork; medium; overall size including frame; and sale price
- A brief description or a few words about the artwork (e.g., your inspiration for the work, the person or place depicted, or the message being conveyed, etc.)







Burbank Art Association – Officers and Chairmanship Positions and Duties 2021-2022

Executive Officers:		
President	Conducts meetings. Appoints special committees. Serves as ex-officio member of all committees.	
Vice President	Assumes charge in President's absence. Responsible for Scholarship Program. Coordinates December Holiday party.	
Secretary	Keeps minutes of all regular and Executive Board Meetings. Distributes copies of minutes to the Board. Keeps binder with all 501(c)(3) records and information.	
Treasurer	Keeps record of all monies received and distributed. Does banking, signs checks with the President. Pays all bills. Supervises collection of fees and disbursements in connection with all exhibits.	
Financial Secretary	Prepares and records annual corporation tax forms as required. Assists Treasurer as needed (e.g., sends sponsorship letters and renewal invoices.)	
Financial Advisor	Advises the association regarding financial matters.	
Chairmanships/Co-Chairs:		
Exhibits (Juried shows)	Arranges time and place of annual Fall and Spring exhibits. Engages judges and handles payment for their services. Appoints members of committee as needed to assist with intake, hanging and preparation. Obtains & distributes awards, ribbons, certificates.	
Exhibits (Geo Gallery)	Arranges group and solo exhibits at the Geo Gallery (except Spring Show).	
Newsletter Editor	Gathers information on guest artists and provides information on BAA activities and other events in the art community. Emails newsletter to members.	

Membership	Submits membership information to Editor for September Newsletter and/or to all interested persons. Collects applications and dues throughout the year; transmits dues to Treasurer. Provides current membership lists to President and Newsletter Editor for email addresses and/or other bulletins.
Programs (1 or 2)	Secures guest artists, demos, lecturers, films, etc. for monthly programs. Introduces guest artists. Secures honorarium for speaker from Treasurer and presents at close of program. Co-Chair assists Chair as needed in planning.
Outside Exhibits (2)	Researches/secures outside venues/opportunities for members to show their work.
Outside Exhibition. Catalog	Coordinates a catalog of members' artwork to present to outside venues.
Website	Keeps website current with all BAA information. Takes pictures of demonstrations at monthly meetings, of Spring & Fall Shows and other BAA exhibits.
Social Media/Publicity	Promotes BAA on social media (e.g., Facebook, Instagram, etc.).
Hospitality	Arranges for refreshments and decorations for all functions. Appoints & coordinates committee of additional hosts as needed.
Host	Greets members and guests at meetings, oversees sign-in sheet, collects guest fees.
Penstrokes	Gathers/collects news and information about/from BAA members. Submits to Newsletter Editor for inclusion in monthly Newsletter.
Advisor*	*Appointed position, usually Past President. Advises President and Board as needed.
